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Our vision for City of Unley



Our **vision** is what we want City of Unley to be in the future.



We want City of Unley to be more **accessible**.



When something is accessible, everyone can use it.



We also want City of Unley to be more **inclusive**.



When something is inclusive, everyone can take part.

We want City of Unley to be a place where everyone can:



• reach their goals



• take part in the community



• feel supported.

The laws that apply



We have a law in South Australia called the *Disability Inclusion Act 2018* (the Act).



The Act explains the rules that everyone must follow.



The Act also makes sure people with disability in South Australia are treated fairly.



The Act says we must have a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan.

We call it our Plan.

United Nations

Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities We also follow the *United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities* (the UN Convention) in our Plan.



The UN Convention is an agreement between countries.



The UN Convention explains how people with disability should be treated fairly.

Our Disability Access and Inclusion Plan



Our Plan talks about what we will do over the next 4 years to make City of Unley more:

- accessible
- inclusive.



Themes are important ideas that come up in different areas of our work and lives.



Our Plan has 4 themes.

We want to support people with disability to speak up for their own rights.



We will create a group of people to:

- look at our Plan
- make sure we meet the needs of people with disability.



We will make sure everyone on our team knows how to work with people with disability.



We will think about training local businesses to work with people with disability.



When we plan new projects, we will talk about how they will be:

- accessible
- inclusive.



We will make accessible documents for our meetings.



We will also make Easy Read versions of our documents.



We will make our council buildings accessible.



We will look at our programs to see if they meet the needs of our community.



We will look for ways to make sure more people with disability take part in our programs.



We will make our events more accessible.



We will pay for important projects that will help make City of Unley more:

- accessible
- inclusive.

We will make sure everyone has the chance to choose who should be part of the Council.



We will add a list of services to our website that can help people with disability speak up for themselves.



We will celebrate International Day of People with Disability.



We will connect with people with disability in a more accessible way.



We will work with **industries** that focus on being:

- accessible
- inclusive.

3. Accessible communities

We can make sure we include people with disability if our:



• public places and spaces are accessible



• community is inclusive.



We will add equipment at our council buildings to help people who have trouble hearing.



We will make our website accessible.



This includes having parts of our website in Easy Read.



We will make our social media posts more accessible.



We will make our public playgrounds more accessible.



We will make online lists for all of our public:

- toilets
- playgrounds.



We will look at street carparks to see if they're accessible.



We will keep adding places to charge devices that help people with disability move around.



We will see what places in City of Unley need to be more accessible.

4. Learning and working

When people with disability work, they can:



• earn their own money



• connect with other people



• take part in the community



• feel like they belong



• do more for themselves and on their own.



We will look at how we hire people to work for us.

When we do this, we will make sure we are more:

- accessible
- inclusive.



We will tell disability groups when we are hiring new people.



We will make information about new jobs accessible.



We will support people with disability when they apply for our jobs.



We will talk about our Plan when we hire new people.



We will make our **policies** more:

- accessible
- inclusive.

We will write a report about it:

- before 31 October
- each year.
