




SCHOOL KOALA CROSSING

Koala crossings help people cross the road safely near schools.

How to recognise a koala crossing



Koala crossings are part-time crossings, they only operate when the yellow lights are flashing.

Working together helps keep children, families and the community safe around koala crossings.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT KOALA CROSSINGS?

Crossing Supervisors

- ✓ Schools may provide school crossing monitors to help children and adults cross safely.
- ✓ Always follow the instructions of the crossing monitor when they are present.

For people using the crossing

- ✓ Follow directions from crossing monitors (when in use).
- ✓ Always use **Stop. Look. Listen. Think.**
 - Make sure vehicles have stopped
 - Make sure drivers have seen you

Remember:

- ✓ When the lights are not flashing, pedestrians, bicycle riders and scooter riders do not have priority to cross.

For drivers, motorcycle riders and bicycle riders

When the yellow lights are flashing:

- ✓ **Slow down** — a maximum speed limit of **25 km/h applies** between the signs marked "When lights flashing".
- ✓ **Stop** for anyone using or about to use the crossing.
- ✗ **Do not park:**
 - within 20 metres before the crossing
 - within 10 metres after passing the crossing
