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### PURPOSE

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The workshop is intended to build on the Shaping Unley Engagement Process outcomes whereby the feedback to be received from Elected Members will inform the development of the City-Wide Parking Strategy draft document.

### DISCUSSION

The City-Wide Parking Strategy (Strategy) is being delivered in two stages. Stage 1 is the development of the decision-making principles and parking management ideas which are required to guide the development of the Strategy. This has been delivered through the Shaping Unley Engagement Process. Stage 2 is the development and adoption of the Strategy itself.

The Shaping Unley Engagement Process has been instrumental in developing a number of 'strategic' principles to guide the development of the Strategy. However, there are a number of 'policy position' specific matters which staff require guidance on from Elected Members.

This workshop intends to inform Elected Members of these specific issues and seek feedback to provide clarity to enable the development of the Strategy with confidence that staff have 'got it right'.

There are four specific issues that will be discussed at this workshop:

- Parking congestion
- Small 'yield' streets
- Driveway line-marking
- Accessible parking zones adjacent residential properties

A second workshop is scheduled to be held with Elected Members on 3 April 2023 to discuss four other specific issues:

- Resident permits
- Business permits
- Pay for Use Parking
- Construction Work Zone Parking

Following this second workshop, staff will present a report to Council at its Meeting 22 May 2023, to seek endorsement of the decision-making principles and parking management ideas (established through the Shaping Unley Engagement Process), as well as the directions to address the eight specific parking issues to be discussed at the two workshops.

#### Key Considerations

- The workshop will be independently facilitated by DemocracyCo, who have facilitated the Shaping Unley Engagement Process panel sessions.
- The workshop is aimed to be interactive and Elected Members will be encouraged to have open discussions and deliberations.
- To enable all four topics to be discussed to an appropriate level of detail, Elected Members will be separated into two groups to discuss separate topics at the same time, with one of the two Members from each Ward representing a topic.
- The final part of the workshop will allow Elected Members to share the preferred outcomes by topic, and all Elected Members can provide feedback and comments for further consideration by staff.

#### Preparation for Members

Background material has been prepared on each topic (listed below) to assist discussions at the workshop:

- Parking congestion.
- Small 'yield' streets.
- Driveway line-marking.
- Accessible parking zones adjacent residential properties.

The material for pre-reading highlights the following for each topic:

- **The key issues** experienced in the Unley context.
- **What we currently do** to address the parking matter.
- Examples (where appropriate) of **what others do** (locally and nationally).
- **Options for discussion** including pros and cons (where appropriate).
- **EM Questions** for discussion.

To ensure that we get the most out of the workshop, it is important that the background material is read prior to the workshop. Although staff will be present at the workshop to run through the material and answer any questions, a detailed presentation on each topic will not be made.

At the end of the workshop, Elected Members will be asked to reflect on the session and provide feedback on what improvements DemocracyCo and staff should consider for the second workshop to be held on 3 April 2023.
